CITY PRESENTS APPLICATION FOR TRAFFIC LIGHT

Both the State Highway Department and the Oakland County Road Commission have received formal requests from the city for the installation of a traffic light at the intersection of Grand River and Orchard Lake Road.

The request was filed with the two agencies last week. It was accompanied by a letter supporting the application for a standard traffic light at the intersection. The filing of the application is in accordance with the regular procedure followed by both the Highway Department and the Road Commission.

It is expected that a traffic survey will be taken at the intersection to determine the necessity for a light. If the survey proves that there is sufficient need, negotiations will be started between the city, county and state regarding the percentage of cost to be shared by each unit for the installation and maintenance of the light.

The Board refused to take action on a request for the establishment of a trailer court on Grand River east of Haggerty Road, claiming that it was in violation of the zoning ordinance.

It was stated in the request that the land was purchased for a trailer court prior to the adoption of the ordinance and that a license was granted by the State in 1951 which was also before the zoning law was adopted.

It was the opinion of the Board, however, that the ordinance still applied in this case since the owner had not executed his intention regarding the property prior to the adoption of the zoning law. The Board also expressed the opinion that the license should be renewed each year, which apparently was not done.
