The Hunter's moon, bright competition for the sun, the Milky Way and meteor showers are thilling of October's astronomical attractions, according to Hazel M. Losh, associate professor of astronomy at the University of Michigan.

Miss Josh points out that the Milky Way will be an attraction across the sky from the northeast to southwest, with the Northern Cross almost directly overhead. The professor adds that there are two meteor showers scheduled for October, the Drancolds around October 3 and the Oriotak around October 2. She says they will be "scanty showers" with just a few stragglers visible here and there.
