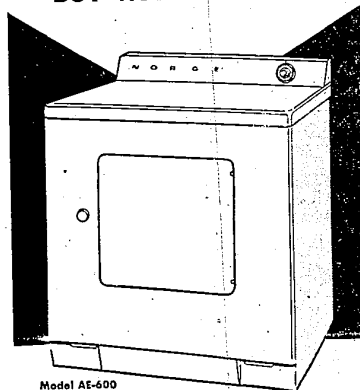

Proceeds of the sale will be used for the Fellowship Fund of the association and to increase the Farmington Library facilities for service to children.

The sale this year will be expanded to include new books and to enable parents and others to order children's books in time for Christmas giving. Slightly used books, phonograph records, magazines and patterns will also be available.

The Fellowship Program of A. A. U. W. with a million dollar fellowship fund, gives aid to American women scholars and to university women of other countries through fellowships and international grants. In the more than sixty years since the first fellowships were given, almost 600 women have been helped through these awards.

Since 1945 A. A. U. W. has also given international grants to women from countries that suffered from the war. Over 300 women have been able to study in the United States and have come from 20 countries.

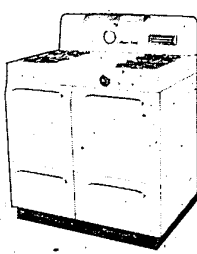

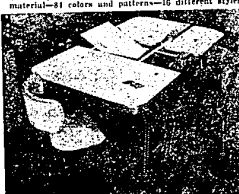
