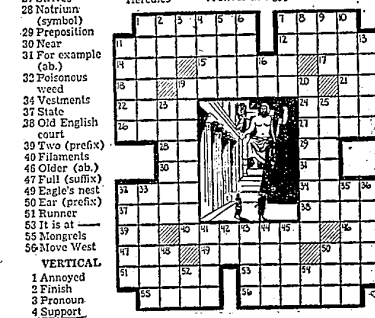

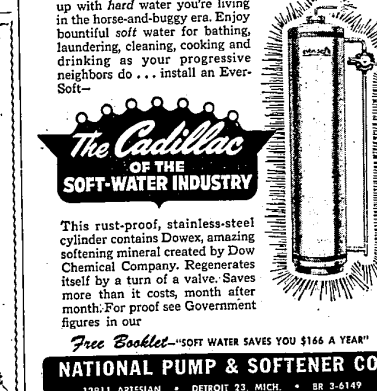

### New Veterinarian Policy Established

To satisfy the growing need of Michigan farm operators for more veterinary service and yet maintain the high educational requirements of the profession is a problem upon which the Michigan Advisory Veterinary Examining board established a new policy recently.

The board met at Lansing jointly with the commission of the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

The board changed its policy on method of admitting candidates to veterinary examination. In the past only persons graduated from one of the 18 approved North American veterinary schools were permitted to take the state examination. Under the new policy, when they make application to take examination, Application may be made to Dr. Lee Davidson, state veterinarian in the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Lansing, who is secretary of the board.
