It was my understanding that a sanitary code was put into effect in Farmington Township a few years ago. Although it has never been enforced on dwellings in existence at the time of passage, I thought it was enforced on new construction.

Today a house was moved onto a lot across from my home. Having lived here for over 11 years I know that a septic tank on that lot will be useless for over half the year since the lot is very low and has very little drainage.

In my opinion, this action, while it may not be violating the letter of the sanitary code, certainly violates the purpose of it and will definitely create a health problem.

It seems to me that such matters should be looked into before a permit is issued for moving a house on a lot.

creeping toward an all-time record of 10,000.

Corrections Director Gus Harrison said that the new \$250,000 dormitory at Ionia Reformatory for 230 more men and the \$50,000 man farm housing unit at Southern Michigan Prison at Jackson will ease the situation for another two years.

"In addition we can shift around and get room for 270 more, which should ease the situation considerably," he said.

To make the picture even brighter, a new 600-man prison will be built at Ionia. It is expected to be ready within two years when the population reaches a desperation point again.

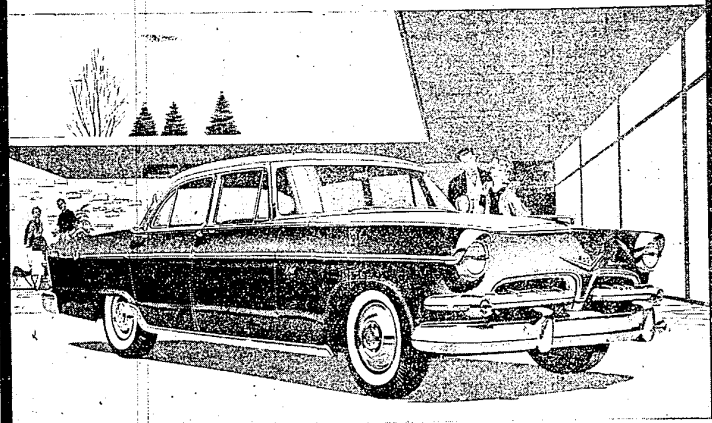

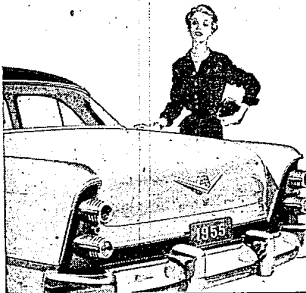
