

LETTER TO EDITOR

To All Township Residents:
 Are you aware of the placement of your tax dollar?
 Through various conditions which warrant very definite and immediate action, as well as a good many others, have found that a change must occur if we are to survive the attack of slums which other cities, towns, and townships refuse to put up with.
 As a voice of experience, I find that either our zoning ordinance, or the means of enforcing it, are inadequate to say the least. Even the State Health Code, which can be enforced anywhere is completely ignored here. At present, I know that absolutely nothing can be accomplished along this line. For example, a particular incident which I know of involves a small (approximately 16' x 18') real estate building on a 40 foot lot, within two blocks of the city limits of Farmington. Although at least four condemn signs were issued when the building was vacant, the building was sold and moved into by seven - yes 7 - no plumbing, no sewer, and no running water. And now, after three weeks, the year has accumulated a stack of unburned papers and trash ten feet in diameter plus more which hasn't even been stacked, to blow around the neighborhood.
 Oh yes, the township office and anyone else who might remotely have any solution have been contacted, by not one but several local people. And what happens? We get regrets on their inability to help us. What, may I ask, is our tax dollar paying these people for?

Appointed Chief Design Engineer At Burroughs

Announcement was made last week of the appointment of Byron A. Runde of 32045 Valleyview Drive, Farmington, to the position of chief production design engineer in the semimatic accounting machine line at Burroughs Corporation plant in Plymouth.

The announcement was made following the moving of that section of Burroughs from Detroit, where it had been a part of the corporate engineering activity. Mr. Runde will be in charge of design and development of new products in the Semimatic Accounting Machine line.

Mr. Runde joined Burroughs in 1952 as an assembler in the corporation's portable adding machine department, and later became an engineering draftsman. In 1953 he joined the engineering group which developed the Burroughs Semimatic Accounting Machine. In 1950 Runde was made an engineer in charge of the special group working on new designs and applications on the Semimatic.

In 1952 he was promoted to supervisor of the accounting machine development section of the corporation's engineering activity. He held that position until his recent appointment as chief product design engineer.

NEW PLANETARIUM AT CRANBROOK DEDICATED SEPT. 30

Climaxing the 25th anniversary of the Cranbrook Institute of Science in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan's first public planetarium was dedicated Friday evening, September 30, and named for Robert R. McMath, distinguished scientist and astronomer, who has served the Institute of Science as trustee since its founding in 1930.

Mr. L. James Bulkley, chairman of the institute's board of trustees, officiated, introducing Dr. Alexander G. Ruthven, president emeritus of the University of Michigan, who gave the dedication; and Mrs. Armand Spitz of Elkhart, Maryland, inventor of the planetarium installed at Cranbrook, who was guest speaker and demonstrated before a small group of invited guests representing the donors; ten business firms, eleven associations and clubs, four foundations, and 150 families. The public has contributed to the cost of constructing a building in the Cranbrook group of six institutions. William E. Kapp, Detroit architect and designer of the new building, donated his services.

Public demonstrations will not be given until November as some of the interior equipment is not yet installed.
