Investment ceremonies were held Wednesday, January 12, for Brownies of Troop 110, Our Lady of Sorrows, at the parish hall of Grand River.

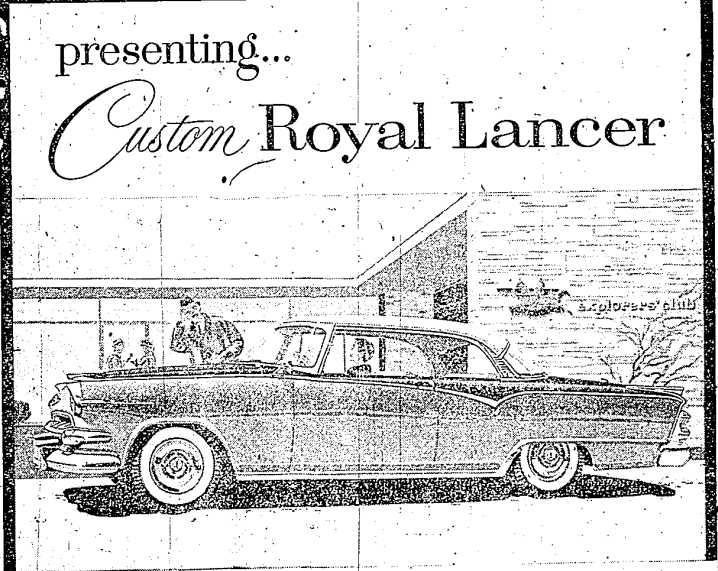
