The law in reference to overtaking and passing a school bus is found in what is commonly known as the "Motor Vehicle Law" Public Acts 1949 No. 300.

The law in reference to overtaking and passing a school bus is found in what is commonly known as the "Motor Vehicle Law" Public Acts 1949 No. 300.

(A) Provides that a driver shall not overtake and pass any school bus proceeding in the same direction as the driver when receiving and discharging passengers.

(B) Provides that a driver may overtake and pass a school bus when it has stopped to receive or discharge passengers, but must bring his car to a full stop at least 10 feet in the rear of the bus and then proceed with caution.

So it is clear that the driver of a vehicle may not under any circumstances overtake and pass in a village or city a school bus stopped for the purpose of receiving and discharging passengers.
