CENSUS BUREAU TO SURVEY SMOKING HABITS THIS MONTH

A national survey of the smoking habits of the American people is being conducted during February by the U. S. Bureau of the Census as part of its current population survey, according to the Census Bureau Office at Detroit which will participate in the collection of the information.

Special questions on smoking are being asked at the request of the U. S. Public Health Service. The information collected will be used in connection with the government's research program on the possible relationship between smoking and various types of disease.

The questions will cover cigarette, cigar, and pipe smoking. Persons eighteen years of age and over will be asked about the number of cigarettes, cigars or pipefuls of tobacco smoked daily, the maximum number ever smoked regularly each day, the number of years they have smoked and other related questions. The answers to these questions will provide basic facts, now lacking, as to the number of smokers and non-smokers by sex, color and other characteristics for each of the major regions of the United States.

The questions on smoking are in addition to the regular inquiries on unemployment and unemployment asked in the current population survey which is conducted each month.

May Teach Civil Defense in Michigan Schools

The U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare has selected Michigan as one of three national centers for an experiment in civil defense education.

The Department of Public Instruction is now preparing a manual in cooperation with the Michigan Office of Civil Defense for use in schools throughout the state. Instructional materials are being prepared for classroom use with the idea of making civil defense a basic part of school programs, taught as a part of all classes instead of as a separate subject.

In many communities the school is the largest public facility for use as a hospital, feeding station or center for welfare services in case of disaster. Civil Defense officials point out.

TOP SECRET

Five buildings within a 25-mile radius of Detroit have been chosen by Civil Defense officials as auxiliary city halls in the event of atomic attack. Location of these shelters is top secret.

A total of 126 courses of study are offered at Michigan State College, 65 of them on the advanced-degree level.
