

### Palette And Brush Club To Meet, February 22

In the summer she is co-director of Crystal Lake Art Center near Frankfort, Michigan.

### Woodcreekers To Hear About New Franklin Church

The Building Committee of the Franklin Community Church is now explaining the proposed floor plans of their new church building in small-neighborhood meetings, pointing out that the present building is used by nearly as many non-church as church groups.

All Woodcreekers are invited to a meeting of this nature to be held at the home of Norman B. Kessler, public relations chairman, on Thursday, February 17, any time after 8:15 p.m.

The inclusion of a store for the church is pointed out by Mr. Kessler as one example of planning for non-church activities in the new building.

A youth room, to be equipped later with kitchenette facilities, will be the center for an expansion of youth facilities. Across the hall will be a committee room, including a fireplace for informal activities, and a hobby room in the same hall.

Storage facilities for the five units of the Girl Scouts using the present church are included, and much undesignated space is adaptable for youth use. Depending on the response of non-members in supporting these "extras," it is hoped that parking facilities might duplicate an outdoor badminton, tennis or other recreational uses, Kessler reported.

Garden clubs, the League of Women Voters, Physchool, and other groups are also included in the planning. The social hall will seat two hundred at tables, and nearly double that in a row-type arrangement. Classrooms on the first level of the new church are flexible in arrangement for the use of smaller groups, with one unit capable of seating over one hundred adults. All rooms in the fourth unit of the building are multi-purpose in nature, Mr. Kessler stated.

Franklin Community Church is the only church in Franklin and vicinity to break ground Easter Day for a \$195,000 new church on the Village Green.

Communists direct their most concentrated work. If they could displace this keystone they would strip our American people of their independence, their freedom -- and a central authority dispensing some form of Socialism would take over.

Think a moment about your freedom, if your rights of ownership were taken away, the ownership would go to some form of government. Your home would not be yours. You would live in it subject to the will of the government. If the stores were owned by the government, you would buy what the government offered at the price fixed by the government. Americans will not vote themselves into such a situation with their eyes open. But with their eyes half open they can be fooled, and bit by bit the right of private ownership can be pulled slowly away from them. We must examine carefully every move toward "public ownership" of anything. In most cases it carries investigation back toward the stagnation of primitive communism.
