

# THIS IS YOUR CHANCE TO VOTE TWICE

### WHY YOU CAN LEGALLY VOTE TWICE FOR JUSTICE ALLEN C. INGLE

On the voting machine, you will find Allen C. Ingle under both the Short Term and the Full Term. The short term is for the period April 5, 1955 to July 4, 1955, while the full term is for the period July 4, 1955 to July 4, 1959. Thus it is important that you vote twice for Allen C. Ingle, on February 21, 1955.

## NO TOWNSHIP COURT BEFORE JUSTICE INGLE

Before Ingle became Justice, there was no active township court. Since Ingle became Justice, the Township Court during 1954 was the largest in the County. This is important to the township, for a Justice has criminal jurisdiction over the entire county. Thus before Ingle became Justice, township residents were compelled to go to other communities.

## THE PROBLEM BEFORE YOU ON ELECTION DAY

If you have investigated for yourself or have talked to someone who has, you will find that Justice Ingle has worked hard day and night to bring to Farmington Township, a Justice Court which ranks among the best in the state. You will also learn that he has established a uniform fine for traffic violations regardless of race, religion, political views, or residence. In other words "Equal Justice for all" is here in Farmington Township. In addition you will find that he has spent considerable money in order to provide the township with court facilities, which he is not required to do. A Justice may hold a court anywhere except in a bar-room. You will find also that he takes his Justice duties seriously, and is constantly working toward better law enforcement while at the same time protecting the constitutional rights of the people.

## WHY DID INGLE BECOME A JUSTICE?

We have all heard the stories about Justice Courts, some are true and some are false. When Ingle first became a Justice, he was determined that the Justice Court would be a Court of Equal Justice for all persons. The road was not easy. Those who were in the habit of not paying for traffic violations found that things were different. Actually traffic violations are committed every day by all of us who drive. If we happen to be unlucky and the Police car is there, we are caught. Many a time during 1953 and 1954, Ingle was told that "This is the last time I will vote for you," merely because the violator paid the same fine as everyone else. During 1953 and 1954, the violator changed, and many now make the remark, "I am glad the officer caught me. It has made me more careful." Others make statements to the effect that, "I am glad to know that I am paying the same fine as others."

## DO YOU BELIEVE IN RUMORS?

Many rumors have been started about Justice Ingle. In hopes of misleading the public. Very few of these rumors have anything to do with the court, but rather are attempts to attack him personally. This is common in any election, those who start these rumors are actually not connected with any candidate, but it seems an ideal time to satisfy some personal, selfish reason. He has erected a building at his own expense in order to provide the township with a court building. Many people believe that the court building on Grand River at Middlebelt is a township building. This is not true, it is owned by Justice Ingle along with the bank that holds the mortgage.

## JUSTICE vs. TOWNSHIP BOARD

The office of Justice of the Peace has no connection with the Township Board. A Justice is a member of the Judicial Branch of our government, while the Township Board is the Legislative branch, as well as the Executive branch.

## GANG FIGHTS, HOT RODS, ETC.

Before Justice Ingle took office, it was a common occurrence to have gang fights, hot rod races on our highways, and other disturbances.

Those who wish to engage in gang fights, or hold hot rod races on our highways, have no desire to do some where they risk the possibility of being arrested and brought before Justice Ingle.

When Justice Ingle first became a Justice, this disturbed him, and rather than wait for the fights or races to begin, he went to the places where these youths gathered, and warned them of what would happen. A few decided to see if he meant it. The result was that Farmington Township does not have the hot rod or gang fight problem any longer, as they found out that he meant it.

The majority of these youths were from Wayne County or other areas, in fact very few lived in Farmington. Before Justice Ingle became Justice, they did as they pleased, as they considered this a wide open area. Now they consider it a closed area and avoid Farmington Township, unless they come here as law abiding citizens.

## WHAT IS A JUSTICE COURT?

Briefly, a Justice Court has two dockets, Civil and Criminal. Included in the Criminal docket are traffic violations. In Criminal cases the Justice has jurisdiction over the entire county. Thus before Ingle became Justice, township residents who received traffic tickets were compelled to go to other communities to settle their violations.

The more serious crimes will usually be committed in an area where there is not an active court. These are deliberate crimes, and those who intend to commit them will think twice before doing so in an area where the court is active.

Thus a strong Justice Court with a Justice who knows how to get things done is of vital interest to the community.

## WHY ARE MANY OF THE TOWNSHIP BOARD CANDIDATES SUPPORTING INGLE

The answer is simple, they have investigated and found that the community can be proud of Justice Ingle's court. They realize the importance of an active court in the township, especially when the court is respected by other communities. Many of their friends from other communities have remarked to them of the fair treatment they have received even though they were not residents of the township.

Those in office now, as well as the other candidates seeking office, who are supporting Justice Ingle, realize that three things are needed in the township:

- (1) A Township Board to serve the people.
- (2) A Justice Court to preserve the peace and provide equal justice for everyone.

## Sincerely Yours Area Planning Commission Seeking Closer Coordination In Developing

Members of the Oakland County Planning Commission met last week with three other planning commissions from the area to initiate closer coordination of governmental planning. Present at the meeting were representatives from the Detroit City and Detroit Metropolitan Regional Area planning commissions plus the Rochester, Avon - Oakland Area Planning Commission and the separate Oakland County unit. P. Ledyard Blakeman, executive director of the Detroit Metropolitan group which includes Oakland County in its surveys, reported first. Blakeman said his organization will join with Oakland and Detroit in an industrial study aimed at obtaining an overall picture of manufacturing in the southeast Michigan section. The survey should help future industrial development plus providing information needed by established firms, he explained. The metropolitan commission is formulating a land-use plan in the area.
