Briefly, a Justice Court has two dockets, Civil and Crim-inal. Included in the Criminal docket are traffic violations, in Criminal cases the Justice has jurisdiction over the entire courty. Thus before ligib became Justice, township residents who received traffic tekets were compelled to go to other communities to settle their violations.
