**CRANBROOK TO BE OPEN IN MARCH ONLY ON WEEK ENDS**

Because of extensive rearrangements of exhibition areas, the Cranbrook Academy of Art Galleries will be open to the public only on Saturdays and Sundays from 2 to 5 during March, according to Wallace Mitchell, recently appointed head of the Galleries.

During the alteration period, week end visitors will be able to see the Levin Collection of work by modern masters and a special student-designed show of ceramic, weaving, textiles, metal-work, home furnishings, painting and sculpture.

In April the regular schedule of openings from 2 to 5 daily, except Mondays, will be resumed. Meanwhile, school classes, art clubs and other organized groups may make appointments for special weekday visits.

The public will get an additional 3350 acres of lands for hunting within 54 miles of Detroit if purchase arrangements can be worked out.

The conservation commission authorized purchase of the James Vernor estate, six miles northeast of Lapeer, during a recent meeting.

"The tract is especially favorable for game area use," says Harry H. Kahl, chief of the conservation department's game division. "It's also very scenic and will undoubtedly receive heavy use for general recreation."

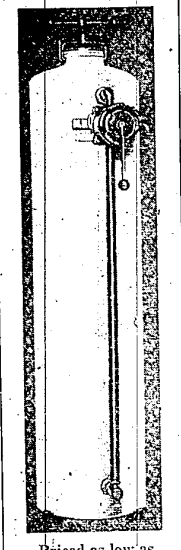
Also, the commission approved purchase of 675 acres of other forest, game and parks lands.

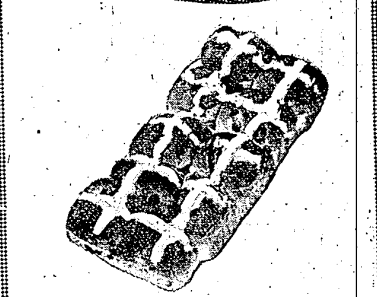

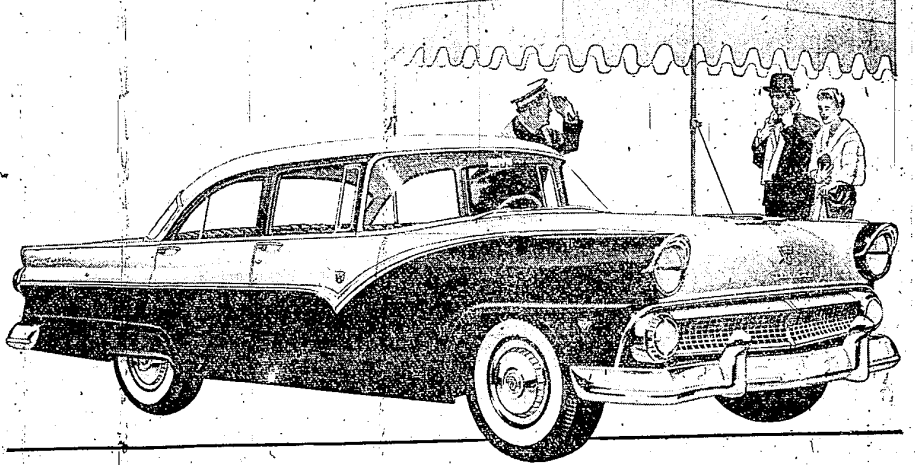

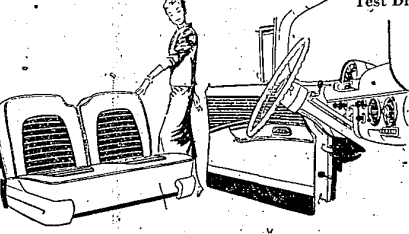
