

**Collect 583 Pints Of Blood In 30 Days**

Dr. Ernest Bauer, blood chairman for Oakland County Chapter of American Red Cross, recently released the following report of blood collections for a 30 day period.

During the month-long collection, eight mobiles collected 583 pints. Of this, 543 pints were released to Oakland County residents hospitalized inside and outside the county.

St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac used the most blood, with a total of 200 pints. The new Beaumont Hospital in Berkley received 27 pints for this period, all used in one week of operation.

## Tickets Available For F.H.S. Cantata

Ticket sales for the vocal department's Cantata, the Seven Last Words of Christ, has begun.

The Cantata is scheduled to be held Tuesday, March 22, at 8 p.m. Four guest soloists will be featured in the program.

In explaining what a Cantata is, Mr. William Feucht, music director, said:

"One definition is that a Cantata is a story set to music. One usually thinks of a Cantata as a religious work. The word 'cantata' from which the word Cantata was taken, means 'to sing'."

"The texts of Cantatas are generally based around biblical subjects. A Cantata is of a much lighter nature than an oratorio such as 'The Messiah', which is also taken from a biblical text."

"The Cantata, which the department is doing is not a long drawn out affair but comparatively short in length. The nature of the Cantata is not 'long hair', as some might put it. But it is lyrical, dramatic, and beautiful," he continued.

"The text or the plot of the Cantata is based on that part of the Bible which is quite significant this time of year, the crucifixion of our Christ."

"The Cantata is performed and recognized by both Catholic and Protestant churches. It is a new venture for the Farmington High vocal department," Mr. Feucht concluded.
