City Council

The zoning ordinance pending a new public hearing set for April 23. The two proposals concern the rezoning of property east of Farmington Road and south of the Cut-Off from suburban to light industrial and property west of Farmington Road and south of the Cut-Off from suburban to general industrial. A public hearing on the two proposals was held last Saturday, but because a quorum of the Council was not present at the hearing, it was decided that a new hearing should be held.

Two additional zoning proposals will be added to the agenda of the April 23 public meeting. One concerns the rezoning of the former Lady of Sorrows School property, Grand River and Moonsey, from residential to commercial for a depth of 600 feet north of Grand River. The second proposal concerns the rezoning of a parcel of land at the corner of Farmington Road and Slocum Drive in the Warner Farms Subdivision from residential to commercial. The Planning Commission has recommended that both proposals be approved.

IN ANSWER to the petition filed March 7 by property owners on Maple Avenue in regard to alleged violations of the zoning ordinance in connection with a residence located at 23220 Maple, the Council explained in a statement that it was pointed out that approximately half of the property is located in a commercial zone and also that it has existed as a multiple dwelling continuously since prior to the adoption of the present zoning ordinance. The clerk was directed to advise the petitioners as well as the property owners that zoning violations exist in connection with the property.

The Council authorized the City Attorney to proceed with the preparation of a special bond ordinance in the amount of approximately \$175,000 to cover the cost of new sewer and water mains as well as pumping facilities for the new sewer line west of Farmington Road and south of the Cut-Off. Tentative approval was granted on the street and lot layout for a proposed subdivision to be developed on the east side of Powers north of Grand River.

The election will include: two Regents of the University of Michigan, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Member of the State Board of Education, and two members of the State Board of Agriculture. Two Justices of the State Supreme Court will be elected on the Non-Partisan Ballot.

Four Proposed Amendments to the State Constitution will also be voted upon at the April 4 election. The leading proposal, No. 3, concerns an Amendment which would authorize the borrowing of not to exceed \$100,000,000 for loans to school districts. Proposal 4 provides that the conduct of non-partisan primary elections and elections for judicial offices shall be prescribed by law. Proposal 5 concerns an amendment relative to the qualifications of supreme court and circuit court judges. Proposal 4 involves an amendment providing that a state board of canvassers shall be established by law.

is expected that the installation will be completed early in December.

A total of 25 fixtures will be installed in the Floral Park section with nine additional units to be erected on Orchard Lake Road between Grand River and Elm Street. The lights in the Floral Park area will be 2,500 lumens while the fixtures on Orchard Lake will be 6,000 lumens. Other units will be installed along the paved streets in Bel-Aire and Warner Farms Subdivision as well as Alta Loma Park Subdivisions 1 and 2.


