A "Well Baby Clinic" sponsored by the Wayne County Health Department in cooperation with the Livonia Health Guild, will be held Wednesday, April 6, at the First Federal Savings and Loan Building, Shelton Center.

The clinic will be held in the community room from 1 to 3 p.m. Appointments may be made by calling Garfield 1-3217.

Children taken to the clinic receive physical examinations at regular intervals and shots against smallpox, diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough. The last report from the Health Department in Detroit disclosed that there were 413 cases of whooping cough reported and two deaths from the disease. This should serve as an example to parents of the importance of having children cared for at these clinics.
