**Explains UNESCO Fund Project**

The second meeting called by the State Committee for UNESCO was held at the Farmington High School library Thursday night with Mrs. Rachel Anderson, chairman of the State Education Committee for UNESCO, present to explain the gift coupon plan to raise funds.

In her talk to the group, Mrs. Anderson pointed out that Farmington was the first group to place the gift coupon plan in operation. The State of Michigan, she added, is the pilot state for the expansion of the plan across the nation.

The film "World Without End," showing pictures of conditions and projects started in Mexico and Thailand, were shown. This film and others, it was pointed out, are available for groups as well as a speaker.

The Mexican and Korean projects were chosen as the objectives of the local money-raising campaign. According to Mrs. E. T. Cope, UNESCO chairman, some groups have already collected funds for these projects.

"We are a great nation and a great people today because we have carried forward the spirit of the Declaration of Independence. We have maintained what is truly a government of the people, by the people, for the people." . . . in the United States, we have a direct or representative democracy—a democracy in a republic.

"Liberty conceives that the mind and the spirit of men can be free only if the individual is free to choose his own calling, to develop his talents, to win and to keep a home sacred from intrusion, to rear children in an orderly society. It holds that man must be free to earn, to spend, to save, and to accumulate property that may give protection and security to himself and to his loved ones."

"Patriotism can be aroused by patriotic teachers, editors, radio news interpreters, film producers, and Government propagandists; but patriotism whose roots grow deep comes from a just government that fosters equal opportunities for all. . . . Such a government is our duty. Thus it is our privilege as well as our duty to love our country, support its Constitution, obey its laws, respect its life, and defend it against all enemies."
