COLLEGE CHOIR TO SING AT FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH

The A Cappella Choir of Concordia College, Fort Wayne, Indiana, under the direction of Herbert Nuechterlein, will be heard at the Easter Drive Faith Lutheran Church, West Outer Drive at James Cozens, on April 29 at 8:00 p.m.

The seventy-voice choir is composed of young men and women preparing for the holy ministry of the Christian teaching profession.

This group of talented young artists is carrying on a tradition of choral singing, including masterpieces of sacred music from the sixteenth century to the present day. Ever since its founding 18 years ago, the Concordia College Choir has included Bach cantatas in its repertoire, as well as compositions by such modern composers as Randall Thompson, Zoltan Kodaly, Virgil Thomson, F. M. Christensen, Healy Willan, and Jean Berger.

Each year the choir makes one long tour and several short trips to bring its message in song to audiences everywhere. Professor Nuechterlein, director of the choir, is head of the music department at Concordia College. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees in music at the University of Michigan. He supplemented his training at the University of Michigan and Northwestern University with special studies and training in conducting and church music with Thor Johnson, Henry Veld, Olaf Christensen, and others.

Student Receives Ford Scholarship

Joseph J. Mitchell, 20116 Renwick, a senior at Clarenceville High School, was one of a select group of 72 high school seniors named by Ford Motor Company this week to receive four-year college scholarships.

Of the group, 49 were chosen from Michigan schools and the remainder from 12 other states across the nation. Over 500 candidates, all children of Ford Motor Company employees, competed for scholarships.

Youths winning scholarships may attend any approved American university. In addition to tuition and academic fees, the scholarships provide partial living expenses to the extent of \$300 for a student living at home and \$250 for a student living away from home. The scholarships are good for four years if satisfactory standards are maintained by the holder, even though the holder may leave the Ford Motor Company.

The Ford Fund also makes a \$500 annual grant toward the general education budget of privately-endowed institutions selected by the winners.
