(Continued from Page One) agreement. The agreement proposed that in cases of emergency the subdivision may obtain water from the well at the new Fourteen Mile Road and that in turn, the school could obtain water from the Franklin Knolls well if the need arose.

Both the Board and the Franklin Knolls representatives agreed that such a plan was not feasible after it was disclosed that the well at the new school would pump no more than 15 or 20 gallons of water per minute.

A lengthy discussion on salaries for administrative personnel was conducted by the Board following disclosure of objections voiced by elementary school administrators over alleged pay injustices. Due to the complex nature of the problem, it was decided to hold a special meeting on April 21 to discuss the matter further.
