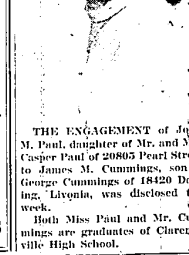
Michael Cicirelli, brother of the groom, was best man. Ushers were Gerald Klump and Nick Cicirelli.
