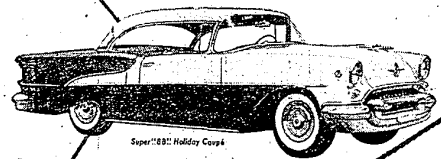
1954 Oldsmobile Holiday Sedan



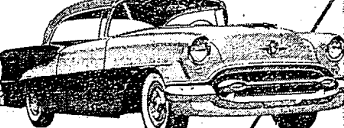

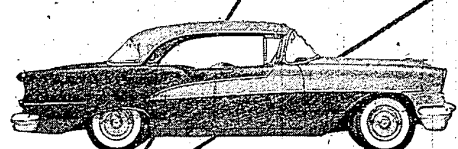
