At 2 p.m. a tea, honoring Mrs. Myrtle Libbitt from the Wayne County Ladies' group will be presented on TV Channel 9.

The purpose of Home Demonstration Week is to acquaint more families, especially young families, with the educational program in homemaking conducted by and for homemakers. Specific objectives are:

To demonstrate the results of research and successful experience in home and family living.

To help consumers develop skills in selecting, buying and using food and fiber.

To assist families in understanding the broad problems of agriculture and their relation to local as well as national economy.

To create homes that will develop good character and wholesome personality in youth.

To encourage families in improving the communities in which they live.

To recognize volunteer leaders of home demonstration groups whose services contribute greatly toward better homes and community life.




