SEEK BIDS ON REPAIR AND RESURFACING OF MAPLE ROAD

One of seven county road projects in lower Michigan now being advertised for bids is the resurfacing of 6.26 miles of Maple Road from the City of Walled Lake eastward to Orchard Lake Road.

The project will consist of widening the present 20 foot wide concrete pavement which is in rough condition to 22 feet and resurfacing it with bituminous concrete.

Completion date for this project has been set for October 1 of this year.

NOW OBSERVING INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS WEEK

Volunteer members of the American Red Cross will join with the volunteers of 12 other countries the week of May 8 - 14 to celebrate International Red Cross Week in honor of the organization's founder, Henri Dunant, born 127 years ago on May 8, 1828, in Geneva, Switzerland.

Observance of International Red Cross Week will take place throughout the United States with many chapters holding open house activities.

The organization came into being after Dunant had witnessed the battle of Solferino in 1859. It was from his personal experience on the battlefield that led him to find a way to protect the sick and wounded in time of war.

This beginning resulted in the first Geneva Convention in 1864 for the care of the war-wounded and the start of the international Red Cross movement.

Since that meeting in Geneva, the Red Cross emblem has come to be recognized as the international symbol of mercy. It now has 75 national societies in all parts of the world.

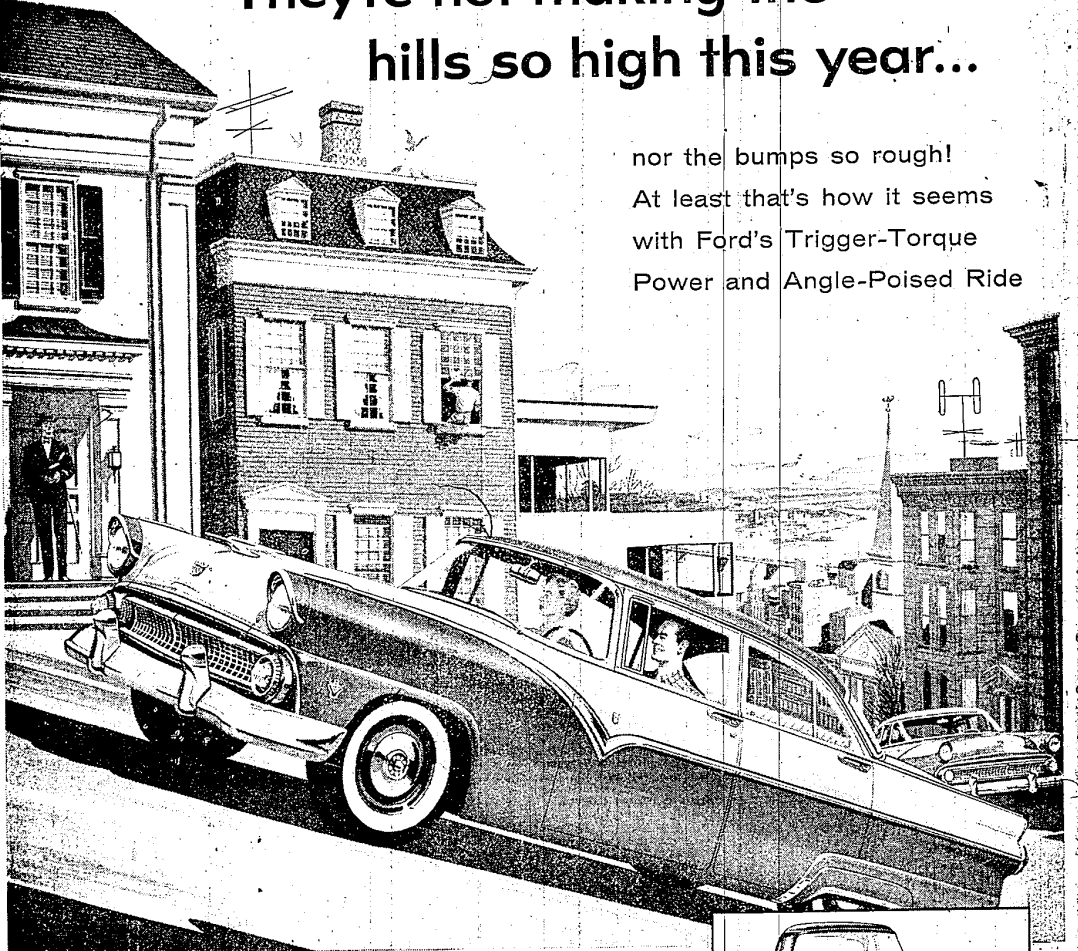
