use water for outside purposes on only odd calendar dates and even numbered properties on even calendar dates, provided, however, that there will be no restrictions on water use on Sundays. The rules shall apply to vacant property as such property lies on the odd or even side of the street. Properties fronting on two of more streets shall be guided by the house number of the main entrance of the property. Mechanical refrigeration systems used for cooling purposes for human comfort, and using Section 36 water, not refrigerated, shall be limited to an average space temperature of not less than 80 degrees F. dry bulb when the outside temperature is 90 degrees F. The regulations apply on every day but Sunday.

The Section 36 system is located in the southeast corner of the Township.

The Committee stated in its report that a careful examination was made of properties and compared to the assessment rolls of the county. Following the examination, the committee equalized the roll by adding to some and deducting from others so as to produce in its judgment, a uniform valuation of taxable property throughout the County. Delos Hopkins, City representative on the board, voted against the adoption of the equalization report.

**LEGAL NOTICE**

**CITY OF FARMINGTON WATER EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION**

I hereby proclaim that a state of water emergency exists in the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan.

During such emergency and until further notice the following restrictions are hereby declared to apply to all water supplied by the City of Farmington:

1. Consumers receiving water at odd street numbered premises shall draw water for use outside of any building between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. only on odd days of the month.
2. Consumers receiving water at even street numbered premises shall draw water for use outside of any building between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. only, on even days of the month.

This proclamation is made under authority of the Water Emergency Ordinance of the City of Farmington.

Any person violating any provision of said ordinance and/or the restrictions above set forth is liable to a fine of \$100.00 plus court costs, or imprisonment for a period of not more than 30 days or by both fine and imprisonment.

**PLAN TO ADD NEW POSTAL SERVICE JUNE 7**

Beginning June 7, a new service known as certified mail will be available to patrons of the Farmington Post Office, Henry Trombley, Postmaster, announced this week.

The certified mail service will be used for first class mail where no indemnity value is claimed. Trombley added. A 15c charge will be made on this service in addition to the regular first class rate for mail postage. For the 15c fee, a certificate of mailing will be given to the sender and the delivering employee will obtain a receipt for office purpose only. If the sender wishes a return receipt a charge of 7c will be made. This is in contrast to the present charge of 7c for registered mail on no value.


