'Trailborn Mike' Prize Winning German Shorthaired Pointer

An award winning dog and the pride of its owner, Carl Johnson of Springbrook Drive, is the German shorthaired pointer, "Trailborn Mike."

Only two years old, "Mike" has already garnered 8 of 10 points necessary for his American Kennel Club field championship rating. To date he has taken three first place ribbons, one second, two third and two fourth place honors. He has also won two trophies, two plaques, and two silver dishes.

"Mike" has also won four of five stakes necessary to become a champion in the National German shorthaired pointer (G.S.P.) Association.

"Mike" was born on October 28, 1952, to Sir Erik von Roff and Ina Traubhorn Scholer. The German shorthaired pointer was introduced into the United States about 20 years ago. They are versatile dogs, used for either game birds or fowl, and are natural retrievers on land and in the water. Short tailed, they can be either liver and white, chestnut, or solid liver colored.

Field trials for the German shorthaired pointer are sponsored in the spring and fall by the S. P. A. and the American Kennel Club. Trials are held at Hillsdale, Michigan, on state-owned land. All pure bred dogs eligible for registration with the American Kennel Club are qualified to be shown in bench shows.

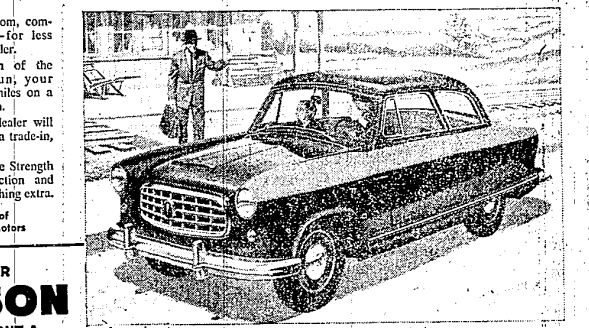
