church and school site and a shopping center. The second proposal involves the rezoning from commercial to Residential III of the Kristrop property located 320 feet west of Orchard Lake Road and south of Thirteen Mile Road. The area is to be rezoned as Residential with the exception of a 300 by 300 foot piece on Thirteen Mile just west of Orchard Lake Road, which will remain commercial.

The third proposal concerns the rezoning of the entire Park Hill Subdivision, located on the west side of Orchard Lake Road north of Twelve Mile, from Residential I to Residential III. The final proposal involves the rezoning from Residential to Commercial of a strip of land 125 feet wide on the east side of Orchard Lake Road between Ford and Ravine Avenues in the vicinity of Fourteen Mile Road.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Special meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington held on May 19, 1955. All members of the Council present.

Special meeting called solely for the purpose of opening and considering bids submitted for the purchase of \$20,000 of tax anticipation notes of the city as advertised in accordance with order of the Municipal Finance Commission of the State of Michigan, dated May 10, 1955, granting the city permission to issue said notes.

The following bids were received and opened to be dated May 16, 1955, maturing August 29, 1955, bearing 2 percent interest per annum, adjustable to date of receipt; any part of principal may be paid at any time prior to August 29, with interest stopping as to principal paid at date of payment.

No other bids.

After reading the bids above set forth, it was moved by Chapman and supported by Calkins that the bid of the Farmington State Bank be accepted, and that the following resolution be adopted:

That the city sell to the Farmington State Bank, of Farmington, Michigan, \$20,000.00 of tax anticipation notes of the city in accordance with the order of permission of the Municipal Finance Commission of the State of Michigan, and that the Mayor and Treasurer of the City be and they are hereby authorized to execute said notes on behalf of the city.

Roll call: Lindbert, Cavanaugh, Calkins, Chapman, and Bates, yes; all members of the Council.

It was moved by Calkins, and supported by Chapman that the meeting adjourn. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m.

the rezoning from residential to commercial of an area west of Mayfield and north of Stecum in the rear of the business place facing Brook Drive home and are now getting settled in a new home.

Another zoning proposal discussed at the meeting concerned the extension of the commercial zone on the former Our Lady of Sorrows School property, Grand River and Mooney, for a distance of 600 feet north of Grand River. 


