## Awarded B.S. Degree In Nursing At Hamline U.

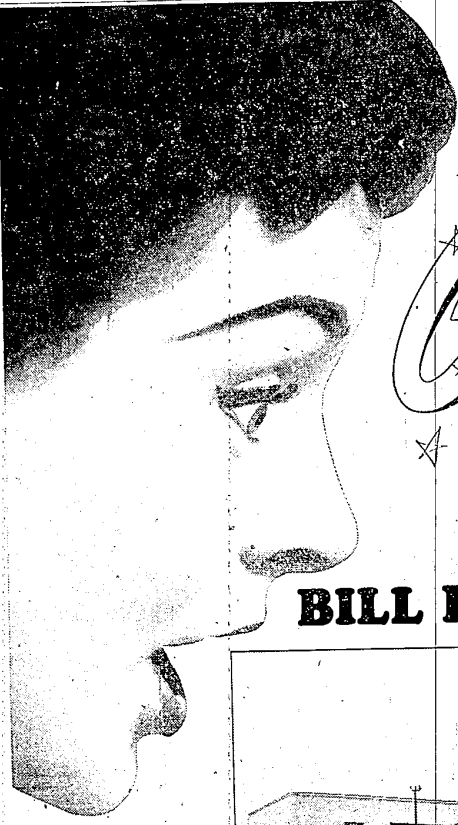
