no need for it. This single incident represents a waste of perhaps \$50 to \$100 million in all. And it is a tiny isolated droplet in the great tide of wasteful spending.

The 1954-1955 Hoover Commission reports that there has been little change in the waste practices since the first Hoover Commission report six years ago. "Agencies of the Federal government continue to build hospitals even though there is a high proportion of unused beds in existing facilities," the Commission says. "The cost of unused beds probably exceeds \$1 billion. The waste is not limited to money. Technical personnel, needed by the civilian population, are used to operate these partially used facilities. The civilian population needs at least 800,000 more hospital beds."

What is the remedy? The Hoover Commission recommends the appointment of a Federal Advisory Council of Health composed of distinguished laymen and physicians; and it sets forth specific measures to tighten up on veterans' medical services and the whole structure of Federal health programs. These recommendations, however, will be worthless unless citizens support them through the use of their influence with their congressmen, and with other less interested citizens. But perhaps, your tax bill isn't burdensome!
