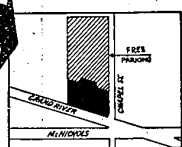

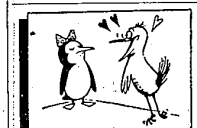

STATE SETS TRAPS IN WAR-AGAINST JAPANESE BEETLE

If you see a small yellow contraction with bomb-like fins suspended on a metal rod about four feet off the ground don't become alarmed.

What you are looking at will be one of 10,000 Japanese beetle traps now being placed in various locations of the state by representatives of the Michigan Department of Agriculture's bureau of plant industry.

Persons in the Detroit area are particularly likely to see them because about 6,000 traps are being put out in that area. About 4,000 will be located from Grand Rapids south and east to the state's southern boundaries.

The Japanese beetle is one of the most harmful of insects. It will feed on as many as 275 kinds of trees, shrubs and plants. Found only in the summer months, it is almost a half inch long and is shiny brown and green with six white dots on each side at the edge of the wing coverings.

Eradication of the pest, according to C. A. Boyer, chief of the Department's plant industry bureau, is not dependent on the Japanese beetles attracted to the traps by the odor of a preparation inside. The trap will attract the beetle from a distance of a quarter mile.

Actually the purpose is to tell trap tenders of the Michigan Department of Agriculture the presence of Japanese beetles in the area. Where beetles are trapped, workers treat the soil within a radius of 300 feet with such insecticides as DDT, Chlordane or Dieldrin. This destroys the grubs which feed under ground on roots for 19 months before emerging the coming year as beetles.

Michigan's aggressive program, the most complete program ever conducted in the state, will prevent areas in the state from being placed under Federal quarantine, which is extremely costly and inconvenient for persons shipping nursery stock or other agricultural products. Fifteen states along the eastern seaboard are under quarantine.

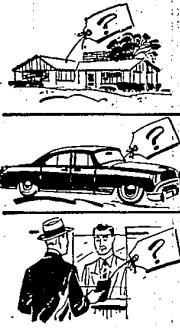
