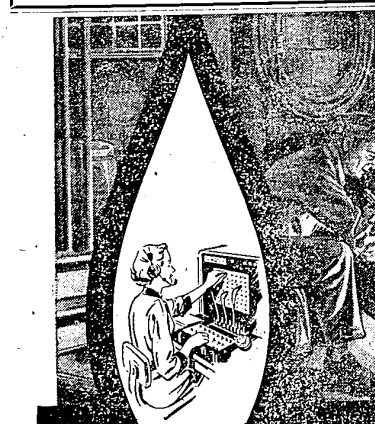

MICHIGAN VETERANS OFF TO BOSTON FOR 1955 ENCAMPMENT

Michigan Veterans of Foreign Wars, 1,000 strong, have begun the trek eastward this week to attend the 50th annual national encampment of the organization in Boston, August 28 to September 2. The Michigan delegation will have a strong interest in the encampment. The state will be honored for placing first in its membership division during the past year.

Other honors will be presented in the field of youth activities and community service. Michigan had one of the most extensive community service programs in the country counting more than 10,000 individual programs.

A small post in Republic, Michigan, and its ladies auxiliary will receive a \$200 cash award for placing seventh among posts in the national community service contest.

Led by State Commander Don M. Draher, Royal Oak, Michigan delegates will seek election of immediate past commander Leon H. Bane, Grand Rapids, to the National V. F. W. Council of Administration, governing body of the organization.

Michigan has no other conditional office with previous mention. Timothy J. Murphy, Boston lawyer, is expected to become the next national commander, succeeding Merton B. Tice, Mitchell, South Dakota.

At least one Michigan unit will bid for a national musical title. State champion band, Morley S. Oates Post 701, Ionia, which placed third last year and second in 1953, will again shoot for the senior band championship.

Business will center about the more than 500 resolutions submitted by individual V. F. W. posts throughout the country. They deal with veterans pensions, legislation, service and rehabilitation, schooling, reserve training, national security and internal V. F. W. affairs.

Hitler's Auto To Be On Display At State Fair

Adolph Hitler's personal armored automobile, the "Great Mercedes," will be shown at the Michigan State Fair in Detroit September 8 through 11.

For protection against assassins, the car has bullet-proof glass, 1/2-inch thick armor plate inside the regular heavy body, specially constructed pistol compartments, and a moveable metal shield which could be raised or dropped out of sight.

The car is almost 20 feet long, has a capacity of 25 gallons and gets from three to four miles to the gallon.
