Michigan's excellent crop of peaches is in peak harvest this week, Michigan Peach Week. The state's crop is estimated at 2 1/4 million bushels, one of the nation's larger peach crops. The harvest is nearly two weeks ahead of normal so housewives will process peaches before Labor Day rather than after as is usually the case, according to the Michigan Department of Agriculture.
