The shop is used for the temporary office of the league, where new homes, new pets and investigations of cruelty are received by phone daily. The constant ringing of the phone regarding humane work has brought the realization that a shelter for homeless and unwanted pets is a necessity. This Fair is held as a fitting climax to National Dog Week. Indications point to a more interesting show than usual, with unusual additions this year. Primarily of all types - as well as more elegant antiques will be shown, along with some rare items. It is an opportunity for animal lovers and antique fans to indulge in a worthwhile pastime.
