BOOKLET OF GAME RECIPES AVAILABLE AGAIN THIS SEASON

"Good Eating From Woods and Fields," popular booklet of game recipes, is again available from the Conservation Department this fall.

With hunting seasons just around the corner, the annual run on the free booklet is knifing into present supplies.

The 24-page colored and illustrated booklet, boon companion to bewildered housewives, lists a variety of recipes for such small game as pheasant, rabbit, goose, duck, beaver, woodcock, opossum, raccoon, muskrat, grouse and woodchuck.

Methods of dressing, cooking and preserving game meat are included.
