## For Proposed Sewer Project

Set Unit Rate At About \$60 Per Building Site

City and Township officials were advised this week in a letter from Ralph Main, Oakland County Drain Commissioner, that a form-la has been established on the proportionate cost of the proposed ula has been established on the oreportional cost of the proposed Farmington Sewer Interceptor. According to the forhula, thi city's share of the project will cost \$107,305,0011 bb \$3,016,853,96. This is based to a large extent on the number of building sites to be served by the proposed inter-ceptor. The report shows that 2,593 lots would be scrved in the store while the Township would for in the township. The city would pay 4,1919 per cent of the groger while the Township would pay 39,7853 per cent. ON THE BASIS of the figures oresented, the cost per lot in both the City and Township would be approximately \$50,00. This in-ludes \$41,38 for construction costs with the balance going for inter-
