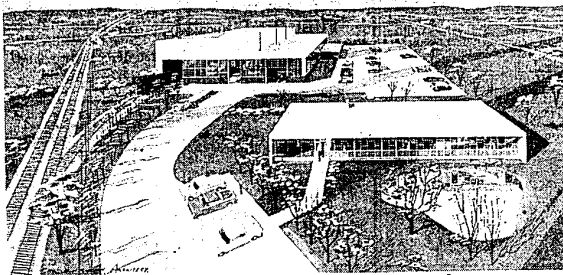

Joining Hardboard Drawer Bottoms

There are two ways of joining hardboard drawer bottoms when building cabinet drawers of the common sizes. The method you use depends on the tools you have at hand. If you have a table saw in your shop then it's easy to groove the drawer front and sides, to take the edges of the hardboard as shown in one of the details. In this case grooves for both the 1/2" and 1/4" hardboard should be run to a depth of about 1/4". After joining the sides to the drawer joint, measure to the bottom of the grooves, allow at least 1/16" in clearance and cut the hardboard bottom accordingly. Round the edges of the bottom piece and will slide in place easily. Before measuring the bottom piece to length, be sure that the front edge is pressed fully into groove in the drawer front. Where you have no means of grooving the drawer front and sides, use narrow cleats. Nail and glue flush with lower edges of front and sides after joining the sides to the end. When fitting the bottom it's a good idea to knock-out it slightly above the plane it to a tight fit before nailing and gluing in place.

#### Woodcreek Family Finds European Tour Interesting And Educational

#### ENTOMOLOGISTS LEARN SECRETS OF MOSQUITO FAMILY

Mosquito plague man from the tropics to the Arctic Circle, from heat waves and to far-inland deserts. Yet, our knowledge of their habits has so far been relatively scant.

Entomologists, studying this universal pest, have learned a good deal about it. Some of their findings are revealed by Allen Franklin in a recent magazine publication.

Only the female mosquito bites, the male not being equipped to. According to current belief, the female of many mosquito species needs an occasional sip of human or animal blood as a kind of vitamin. Without this rejuvenating charge at least once every 25 generations, the breed begins to weaken and die.

Franklin's article states that the female mosquito's high-frequency drill slips easily through the toughest skin. Generally, she can take off before you stop her. The sudden tension of your skin "telegraphs" the blow. To the mosquito, the slightest nervous rippling beneath her is like an earthquake.

The pests seem to bite most often at night probably because the species that is the biggest nuisance happens to be a night-feeder. The female finds her way to the target in the dark by means of a "chemoreceptor" — a combination sense of smell and radar-like sense of "feet" beamed to the ground and odors given off by the human body.

The common house mosquito seldom flies more than 1000 feet from its birthplace. Some of the big salt-water marsh breeders, however, can raid towns 50 miles distant.

The male mosquito lives only eight or nine days, the female about 20. In her life span, however, the female of the common species lays about 100 eggs, and in temperate climates 15 generations are raised in a season. The resulting progeny, if unmolested, would reach astronomical figures.

Mosquitoes are actually good for something. Without mosquitoes as food, many insect-eating birds and animals might perish, allowing even worse pests than mosquitoes to plague us.

#### COMPARE FOODS

"Compare" is a good word to remember when buying eggs. It's always a good idea to compare the amounts of eggs by weight and the prices of the various sizes. Government standards for eggs require that those offered as a certain size weight a certain minimum. Large size eggs must weigh at least 56 grams to the dozen; medium must weigh at least 21 ounces; and small must weigh at least 18 ounces a dozen.

Recently, Conservation Department field workers found numbers of the rabbits have been released in Michigan for dog field trial work. Releases have been made in several southern Michigan areas.

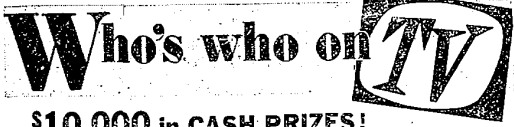
