New Rug Fabrics Need Special Care

Many of the new rug fabrics are special care because of unusual weave, fiber, or color. Freeze or twist rugs, for instance, should be given extra daily and weekly cleanings, points out Mary Hixon, Oakland County Home Demonstration Agent. When they are commercially cleaned, a dry cleaning method should be used because a soap and water shampoo may remove the twist.

Periodic wet shampooing is necessary for luster type rugs, with special care taken to keep the pile yarns lustreless. Adhesive-seam rugs and carpets with a coated backing can be cleaned professionally, but should be kept flat during the cleaning.

White wool carpets must, of course, be cleaned often, reminds Mrs. Hixon. Special care must be given by the cleaner because they may become yellow if ordinary soaps are used in shampooing or stay if dry cleaned with impure solvents. Manufacturers' tags and leaflets should be consulted about care of rayon or part-rayon carpets and rugs.
