

Franklin Church Forms New Choir, Adds Member To Youth Staff

The creation of an additional choir as part of the musical advancement of Franklin Community Church was revealed by Mrs. H. F. Barr, chairman of the music committee, when she announced that Mrs. L. E. Balch has been added to the volunteer music staff.

Mrs. Balch, an experienced organist and choir director, will lead the junior choir, consisting of four through sixth grade pupils. They rehearse on Friday afternoons after school and will give various services of the church and church school.

The additional choir is being formed by dividing the present church choir into two groups. A youth choir and an adult choir. This change, Mrs. Barr said, will give a full choir at both the 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. services.

At present, the youth members of the choir rehearse at 7:30 p.m. each Wednesday preparing for their first separate appearance on the First Sunday in Advent, November 27.

Adults join the rehearsal at 8:00 p.m. for a joint practice for current services. At 8:30 the youths leave and the adult choir prepares its music for the Advent season. Mr. Henderson organizes both of these choirs and Mrs. G. W. Wright is organist for all three.

The church is welcoming additional chorists, especially in the adult choir.

Another step in the expansion of its youth program has been taken by Franklin Church with the addition of a part-time staff worker with junior high youth. The new staff member, selected by a special committee of parents and education commission members, is Lester Johnson of Royal Oak.

A sophomore at Wayne University, Mr. Johnson has been active in various phases of youth activities in his home church and is an active member of the Wesley Foundation at Wayne. He began his work a week ago Sunday when he met with junior high youth in an organizational meeting.

The new group will meet each Sunday at 5:00 p.m. until 6:30 p.m. for activities that will include worship, discussion and recreation. A Sunday retreat is planned soon. Mr. Johnson will be assisted by parents.

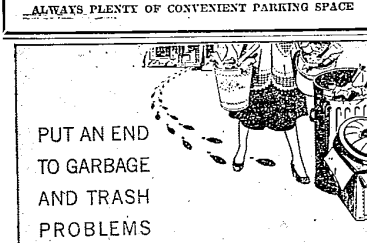

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE LECTURE PLANNED FOR SUNDAY, NOV. 6

A lecture will be given on Sunday, November 6, by George Channing of San Francisco at the Eight Church of Christ, 2001 Grand River Avenue at Evergreen Road. The lecture, entitled "Christian Science: Its Assurance of Guidance to Men," will be held at 2:30 p.m.

The public is welcomed to attend. A section of the church auditorium will be held open until ten minutes before starting time for persons who have never attended a Christian Science lecture, and suggest that such persons make themselves known to one of the usherers.

Mr. Channing worked for the Detroit Free Press before World War I, and for The Detroit Journal after the war. He continued newspaper work in the west coast, including two years as city editor of the Seattle Star. Later he joined the Christian Science church and entered the Christian Science profession.

In 1934 Mr. Channing was made a teacher of Christian Science, and has served the church in numerous capacities. He has been a lecturer at the Christian Science Publishing Society, director of the Christian Science religious education program, and a member of committees on publications. He is again serving on the Board of Lecturers at the present time.
