increase on the tax rolls, as individual drainage districts are completed.

But the township board did not commit itself to this policy, and eventually it will be decided by the new council for the City of Farmington Hills.

The acceptance of the master drainage plan is only one of several major efforts at town hall to put in sewer water and drainage for the development of the remaining vacant areas in the township.

Financial arrangements for the first phase of city water eventually to serve the whole northwest and west side of the township have been finalized. Financing is still being worked out for the last remaining major sanitary sewer trunk to serve the Quaker town area and northwest. Developers with large land holdings have demonstrated a willingness to pay large sums of cash in advance toward the installation of this new plumbing, necessary to

the development of their property. This in turn points to a building boom, mainly in residential housing, in the near future.

New Synagogue Needs Variance

FARMINGTON A new synagogue to be built at W. 11 Mile Road and Inkster in Farmington Township is coming before the Zoning Board of Appeals Tuesday, June 19, at 8 p.m.

Charles H. Rosenzweig, Oak Park, wants to build an orthodox synagogue on a 10-acre parcel on the northeast corner of the intersection.

Although churches are allowed in a residential zone,

a zoning variance is necessary.

The Coventry Subdivision Civic Committee is opposed to the project, and is collecting legal fees for a possible court fight, according to Harry B. Nosanchuk, of the civic committee.

Homeowners are opposing the construction of the building, arguing it would violate the integrity of a single-family area, create noise and traffic and depreciate the value of property in the area. Nosanchuk said.
