that something be done about the situation. At that time cost estimates were secured on the construction of a new bridge and the widening and partial straightening of the road. It is estimated that the project would cost in excess of \$175,000, officials stated.

The City Manager reported that the recommendations will probably include suggestions on the erection of additional warning signs at the approaches to the hill as well as possible reflectors along the roadway. Some consideration may also be given to the posting of speed limit signs along the road.

James Tennant, City Manager, stated that the proposals will be discussed with Farmington school officials and presented to the City Council for consideration. In the meantime, the School Board is securing cost information on portable blinker lights which could be placed on the road in the vicinity of school buildings.

Legislators Visit Childrens Hospital

Members of the Appropriations Committee of the State Senate visited the Farmington Children's Hospital this week in connection with the proposed purchase of the facilities by the State for the care of mentally retarded children.

Charles F. Waag, state mental health director, has recommended that the State purchase the hospital along with two other installations. The Farmington hospital would provide facilities for 300 children. It has been offered to the State for \$900,000.

Governor Williams has asked the Legislature for \$250,000 to remodel the Farmington hospital. The purchase of the facilities, well as the appropriation for remodeling, is part of the overall program which is being presented to the State Legislature, now in Special Session.

The purchase of the Farmington hospital and lease of the Fort Custer Hospital at Battle Creek, as well as the new units at Mt. Pleasant, would solve the problem of mental health facilities for 1,120 children with the remaining 130 to be absorbed in present hospitals throughout the State.

Plan To Expand X-Ray Program

Public health authorities estimate that 1,200,000 Americans need medical supervision for active or inactive tuberculosis, the Tuberculosis and Health Society reports.

Of this number, 400,000 have the disease in its active infectious form. Of this number 150,000 either don't know that they are sick or their cases have not been officially reported. These are the people who are a menace to their fellowman because they carry TB germs to infect their friends and relatives. It is these "unknown" people in whom tuberculosis has never been discovered, who represent danger to the health of the community.

In Michigan each week there are more than 100 new cases of TB reported — 5764 during 1954 — most of them in the advanced stages of the disease. The best weapon against the disease is the chest x-ray and less than one-fifth of Michigan's population is screened through all known chest x-ray programs. Free chest x-rays are available to everyone in the metropolitan area.

Plans are now under way by state and voluntary health agencies to step up the chest x-ray program so that more people will be screened and additional cases of TB taken out of the community.

In Wayne County last year there were 8,745 new cases of TB found and 405 people died with the disease.

The Tuberculosis and Health Society through its annual sale of Christmas Seals is continuing and enlarging its program to fight tuberculosis by working towards prevention of the disease and providing rehabilitation for TB's victims.

This year the funds raised by the Society with its double-bar cross Christmas Seals and the Detroit Tuberculosis Sanatorium's Single Seal sales will go into one fund to increase the strength of the tuberculosis control program in Wayne County.

TOP WRESTLERS SLATED FOR MATCH AT OLYMPIA NOV. 9

Verne Gagne, who will battle massive Yukon Eric in a headline match at Olympia Wednesday, November 9, is one of the great scientific wrestlers of any era.

Although still a young man, he has been a top-flight schoolboy, collegiate, and professional wrestler for close to 20 years. In addition, he mastered a more deadly science of destruction in his Commando training while serving with the Marines in World War II.

At the University of Minnesota, Gagne starred in both football and wrestling. He has won four Big Ten wrestling championships, two NCAA titles and one National AAU crown. He was also a member of the 1948 Olympic team.

He turned pro in 1948 and has consistently whipped much bigger men through his application of the scientific principles of wrestling. He has been the junior heavyweight, under 205 pounds champion since 1950.

Yukon Eric, on the other hand, has never had any formal schooling in wrestling. As a youth, big for his years, he took on his fellow lumberjacks in no-holds-barred bouts that ended only when one contestant admitted he had had enough. Yukon quickly won the admiration of the lumberjacks because he never quit.

A tremendous man, who stands six feet tall, weighs 280 pounds, and has a chest expansion of 67 inches, Yukon Eric has been tough to beat ever since he invaded the pro circuits of the U. S. after World War II.

He still lacks the finesse that distinguish such wrestlers as Gagne, but he makes good use of his immense strength, his native know-how, and his immunity to punishment. He has appeared several times at the Olympia and has always given a good account of himself.
