WOMEN NEEDED TO
HELP STAFF LOCAL
BLOODMOBILE UNITS

Oakland County women who find they can spend a few hours in volunteer work are offered a unique opportunity to be a good neighbor in the community.

The blood advisory committee of Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, has adopted a plan for staffing the area's bloodmobiles. Just three hours of training and six hours aid a year can mean the difference between a community resident and a community "good neighbor."

This plan was adopted at the October 20 meeting of the blood advisory committee headed by Mrs. John Blanchard of Bloomfield Hills.

In the past, area mobiles were staffed only by members of service groups; Gray Ladies, Nurse's Aides, Staff Aides and members of the Motor Service. Workers in these groups spend much more than three hours in training, thus the new plan is an economical plan. It also lessens the strain on these groups.

According to the plan, each blood collection area has a staff chairman whose duty it is to recruit, train and assign volunteers strictly for work on mobiles.

Mrs. John Blanchard, chairman for the Oakland County Advisory Committee, says that these trainees will not take the place of service group aid but will supplement it.

The plan, endorsed by Dr. Ernest Bauer, chairman of the county's blood program, will support the idea of the national Red Cross organization; the work of mobile visits is a "product of the efforts of the local sponsoring group," that is, the persons who benefit from the blood.

Meeting with the committee at the chapter house in Pontiac were the area mobile recruitment chairmen, Mrs. N. E. Durocher, who handles the Pontiac area; Mrs. Royward Larchen of the Birmingham-Bloomfield area.

"The committee has 58 mobiles scheduled for the 1956 calendar year. Mrs. John Blanchard, Bloomfield Hills, chairman, says that 27 more mobiles will be needed even if each mobile meets its 100-pint quota.

Sessions in any area are open to all interested persons, but the committee advises attendance in the area in which the volunteer will work.

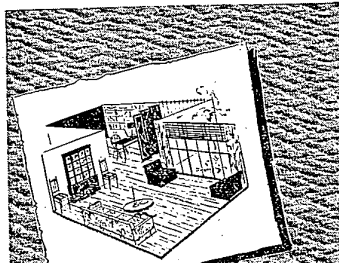
More than 20 sparkling blue lakes can be seen at a glance from the twin observation towers of the Irish Hills near Detroit.

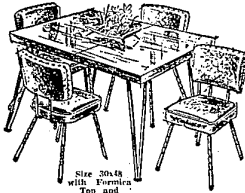
