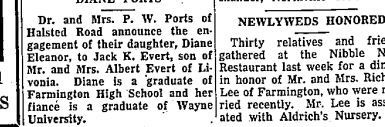
Corsages will be presented at the Bazaar House and prizes will be awarded later in the afternoon at the Tea House.
