### Leader Dog Week To Be Observed In Michigan December 4 To 10

December 4 to 10, this year, is to be known as "Leader Dog Week."

Leader Dog Week has been set aside as a time to draw the attention of citizens of the state to an important phase of rehabilitation for the blind. Since a school was founded, nearly 1,000 dogs have been trained to escort their new partner safely wherever they go.

Many still do not know that Leader Dogs are available. In Michigan, a training center is available to offer its facilities to everyone qualified to get a Leader Dog.

Graduates of the school are not required to pay the \$150 in cash, but may amortize payment over a long period of time. Officials of the school explain that the \$150 is only a "token" payment, anyhow. War veterans need pay nothing.

The balance of the cost — \$1,100 — is contributed by the Michigan United Fund of the Community Chest, Lions Clubs of the Midwest, charitable minded service clubs, sororities, other organizations and individual donors.
