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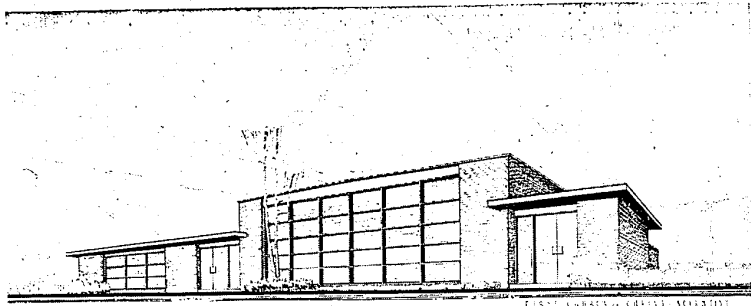

Interview Local College Freshmen

The annual principal - freshman conferences at various colleges were attended by Gerald V. Harrison and Mr. Timmons, senior advisor.

The University of Michigan conference was held November 18. Similar conferences were held at Western Michigan November 17 and at Michigan State University November 22.

Plans toward State coordination in treatment of delinquency were approved at a conference of teachers and administrators last Saturday, December 3. The meeting was the annual conference for teachers of the socially maladjusted held at St. Mary's Lake in Battle Creek on December 2 and 3.

Chairman of the conference was Rudolph Yanke of Boys Republic at Eight Mile and Inkster Roads. Others in attendance from Boys Republic were Hartley Thornton, Dale Sutherland and Tex Ankel, all members of the home's teaching staff.

The feeling of a need for more coordination on a state-wide basis at the conference culminated into the formation of an active committee to study the proposal. Presentation of a plan for creation of a State Youth Authority will be one of the functions of the group. It was determined that a state board could function mainly in the area of diagnosis and commitment and would foster a more complete program of diagnosis and assistance to judge in placement work.

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Army Recruiters Set Up Office At City Hall

A United States Army recruiting service is now being offered in the Farmington area by members of the recruiting office at Grand River and Southfield.

A representative will be in the Farmington Municipal Building each Monday and Thursday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Interested young men may, at that time, obtain information in regard to regular Army enlistments and reserve affairs.

The Army is placing particular emphasis at the present time on the enlistment of high school graduates for a technical school of their choice. If accepted for a particular school, the enlistee is guaranteed attendance upon successful completion of eight weeks of basic training. Recently discharged service men may also enlist for a school.

Also of interest at the present time is the opportunity to enlist for a branch of service such as: Military Police Corps, Signal Corps, Ordnance Corps, Infantry and others.

Young men whose service interest includes a desire to travel and see foreign lands, strange customs and people have an opportunity for foreign service which includes additional pay. Further, it is possible for two or more friends to enlist as a "buddy group" and be certain of staying together, at least through basic training.

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
