# READY HUNTER POST CARD SURVEY FOR FIRST OF YEAR

FOR FIRST OF YEAR More than 10.000 Michigan hunt-ers will be asked to participate in the annual post card survey of the 1955 firearm deer season. First mailings of the Conserva-tion Department question as muting license lists are compiled. A statistically-based cross-sec-tion of hunters will be asked about their success - or lack of it - and hunting activity. Informa-tion obtained in the survey pro-vides a close estimate of the to-tal kill, hunting distribution and other basic data used in establish-ing hunting regulations and in other aspects of deer herd man-The former paractice of asking

other aspects of deer nerd man-agement. The former practice of asking every hunter to fill out a report card on his deer hunting results was abandoned this year in favor of the more accurate post card sampling sampling. Under the present system, ev-ery 40th hunter on license lists is contacted in the survey.
