FIFTEEN LIVES Further discussion on the possible advantages of adopting Township ordinances in regard to police matters was conducted at the conference, and it was indicated that the matter would be investigated. The question as to whether Russell Conway was to continue as a relief officer was also discussed. Blanchard stated that this was not a Board meeting, but that he would check into the matter and let Conway know if he was to work.

Yakes stated that he felt the Police Chief should have more authority in administrative matters pertaining to the department. He added that he had told Conway to begin work on November 14, after the Board had hired Conway as a regular officer. Then, at a later meeting, the starting date was set for November 22. As a result, Conway's regular pay would not have started until November 22, and he would not have received his first pay until December 29. Conway resigned as a regular police officer because of the delay in his starting time.

Trustees Thomas Tardy and Ward English both questioned whether there was need for as extensive a master plan as proposed by the Planning Board. Each expressed the opinion that hiring planners from the University of Michigan or Michigan State University seemed less expensive and would fulfill the need for planning assistance in the Township. Trustee Eagle further stated that he felt planning would be needed primarily to the point of locating the most favorable sites for industrial development in the Township. Treasurer Clayton Goers remained neutral while Trustees Fred Westlake and Mrs. Elise Avery spoke out as highly in favor of the Planning Board's proposal as outlined. Westlake stated that the units of government which he had contacted regarding the planning consultants recommended master planning in general and spoke highly in favor of it. Westlake further stated that he felt a master plan was the only possible way in which controlled development of the community could be obtained. Mrs. Avery expressed full agreement with him and commended the Planning Board for its efforts. Members of the Board voicing objection to the master plan gave reasons for their changed opinion as indicated by the unanimous vote of approval. Work will be started on the master plan as soon as details of a contract with the planning consultants is worked out. The first step to be taken in the development of the master plan will be that of assembling the planning and factual picture of existing conditions in the Township.

Oakland County Red Cross Services Increased In 1955, Study Reveals

A study of the records of Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, reveals an increase in service in the chapter's major functions during 1955. Figures show a definite upward

swing in blood collections. In June, 1954, bloodmobiles collected 353 pints against 1955's 712 pints for the same month. Boosted activity of the blood advisory committee under the chairmanship of Mrs. John Blanchard of Bloomfield Hills accounts, in part, for the increase. Red Cross officials stated. A new training program was inaugurated during 1955 which put the tasks related to operation of mobile units in the hands of persons trained specifically for the work. This relieved volunteers trained for other phases of Red Cross work. Over 100 persons were instructed in mobile operation through this program. Latest figures show that 7,889 pints of blood were released to Oakland County patients in 1955. Under the direction of Mrs. Dalton F. Sifton, mobile recruitment chairman, 72 mobile vans were scheduled for 1956. A total of 84 vans are needed to meet the demand. Also new in 1955 was the formation of a regional blood committee. Two representatives from each county participating in the Detroit Regional Blood Center met each month to correlate work of the member counties and to assist in scheduling and recruitment of donors. Red Cross Home Service, a phase of the chapter's work dealing with aid to servicemen and their families, handled over 6,000 individual cases during 1955. This aid is extended to include over 2,000 servicemen given assistance in claiming the Korean War bonus. Mrs. Ruth Spurlock, director of home service for the chapter, says that her office handles about 500 cases per month. Ralph S. Forman, chairman of First Aid, reports that the chapter certified 39 new instructors during the past year. Instructors issued 1,702 certificates in junior, standard, and advance first aid to trainees in 86 classes. Under Forman's chairmanship, a first aid instructor's club was formed with David Warblow of Pontiac as program chairman. First aid volunteers worked 2,447 hours during the Holiday Highway Patrol program on Memorial Day, July 4, and Labor Day. Volunteers set up first aid stations at the National Skeet Shoot, Berkeley Days, Sportsman's Guild, Boy Scout Camporee and National Go Day for a total of 7,157 working hours. Out of Oakland County's 239 public schools, 74 participated in Junior Red Cross activities. During the year, the Chapter was assisted by more than 2,000 different volunteers.

Intense Teacher Training Program Offered At Wayne

The teacher preparation plan which enables college alumni under 50 years of age to become school teachers will again be available to men and women in southeastern Michigan, according to College of Education officials at Wayne University in Detroit. The plan, intensive Teacher Education Program, is designed as a method by which the critical teacher shortage can partially be eased. Information about the program can be obtained from school superintendents in Oakland, Macomb, Wayne and other counties in southeastern Michigan or from Dr. J. Earl Vivier, coordinator of Off-Campus Programs at Wayne University. He can be reached at TE-1-450, ext. 536. A 24-week period of intensive teacher-education leading to state certification for teaching in Michigan elementary schools is offered. The program is operated in cooperation with school superintendents in the greater Detroit metropolitan area, consists of 18 weeks of student teaching in or near the student's home community plus an off-campus workshop in elementary education. The workshop meets three afternoons each week, commencing with the student teaching is carried on five full mornings a week. Applicants who join this program in the spring are entering a second six-week summer session where courses in the History and Philosophy of Education; Survey of Public Education; and Literature of the Social Sciences Materials for Elementary Schools are offered. Satisfactory completion of the program, in excess of the earning of 10 semester hours of credit in professional education, will enable participants to apply for positions with school boards anywhere in Michigan. Qualified men and women under 50 years of age can begin their training during the spring session starting February 6 and ending June 15. These candidates will continue the program during the summer session from June 28 to August 3, 1956. Upon completion of the program in August, the candidates will qualify for a Michigan Provisional Teaching Certificate and will be eligible for teaching position in Michigan schools.
