CHANGES, GROWTH HIGHLIGHT --



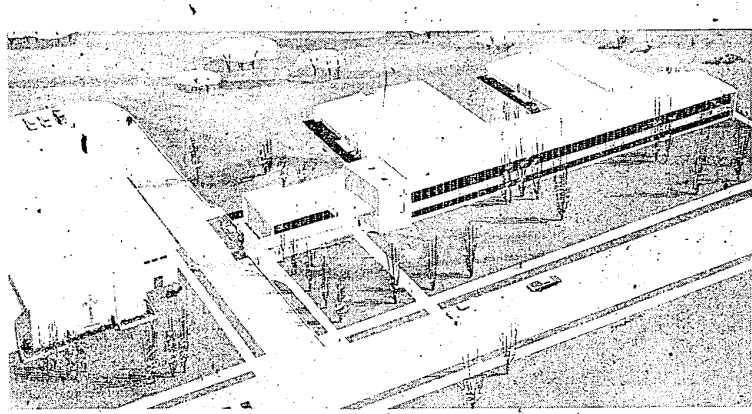
Pictorial Review Of Past Year

The year of 1955 was an eventful one in the City and Township of Farmington with several changes taking place and advances being made. On this and the following page is given a pictorial review of some of the highlights of the past year in the community.

Only a portion of the many eventful happenings could be presented due to a limited amount of space. Many other important events which took place during the year were not told with pictures, but were presented in their entirety to readers of "The Enterprise" in story form.

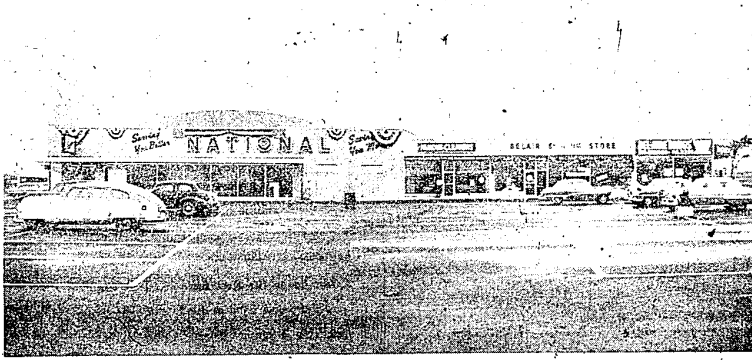
A TOWNSHIP primary election was held in February of 1955 with a large field of candidates running for offices. Incumbents Supervisor Ernest Blanchard and Clerk Harry McCracken both won out over a strong field of opposition. Only one Township Board seat was won by a non-

incumbent. Elise Avery unseated incumbent Board Trustee Edward Shaver by a slim three-vote margin. Only 27.6% of the registered voters in Farmington Township cast ballots at the election.



MARCH was highlighted by the announcement that Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church would begin construction of a 20-classroom high school building as soon as weather permitted. Details indicated that the new high school would accommodate

approximately 400 students. Work was started early in April on the modern, tri-level building at a site fronting on Power Road just north of the present church. Some of the building is now in use although construction has not yet been completed.



THE FIRST shopping center in Farmington outside of the central business district, Bel-Aire Shopping Center, was officially opened the latter part of July at the southwest corner of Orchard Lake and Ten Mile Roads. The center, offering approximately 24,000 square feet of floor space and parking for approximately

350 cars, provided the heavily built-up communities around it with five different shopping services. Although no other community centers have been opened in Farmington as yet, indications are that one, and possibly more, will be established in the near future.

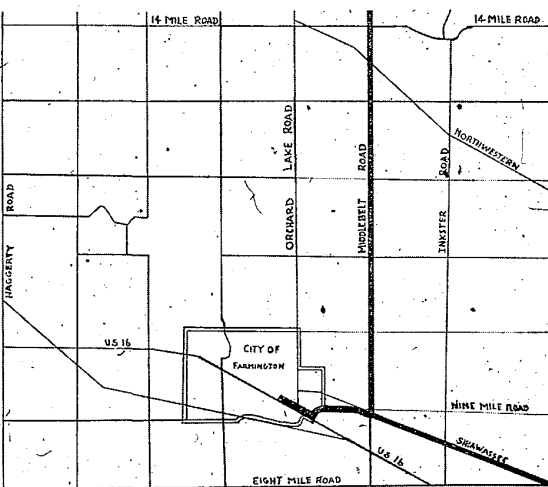

A PROPOSED route for the Farmington Interceptor Sewer system was laid out in June of 1955 to provide a main trunkline sewer for Farmington City and Township as well as Waterford Township and parts of West Bloomfield and Southfield Townships. The interceptor was designed to provide sewage disposal service for heavily populated areas in the suburban communities by affording a tie-in with the Detroit Sewer System. Details of financing and laying the interceptor were worked on throughout the remainder of the year. It now appears certain that funds will be raised to complete the project. Work in the interceptor will likely begin in 1956.
