

# YEAR OF 1955 IN FARMINGTON COMMUNITY




THE ROUTE of the new Farmington to Brighton Expressway, US-16, was disclosed early in 1955. Shown above is the original map of the proposed expressway route.



THREE NEW elementary schools were opened in the Farmington Public School system in September. Shown above is the Eagle School, located at Fourteen Mile and Middlebelt Road. The two other new schools are located at Gill

Road and Colfax and at Shiawassee and Tuck Roads. A total of 42 more elementary classrooms were provided in the School District with the opening of the three new schools.




ANEW GYMNASIUM was opened at Farmington High School early in the school for providing additional education facilities and a mach-needed, larger additorium for the community. Designed for a variety of uses, the Egm is equipped with a stiding door, dividing the

total floor area in half. This enables the school to conduct physical education classes for both hops and girls at the same time. When opened, a large basketball court with ample seating space for spectators or an equally large auditorium for non-athletic events is provided.




DIAL TELEPHONE service was inaugurated in Farmington on August 21, bringing to an end manual operation of telephones in the community. All operations, except the business offlice, were shifted to the new Bell Tele-

phone Building on Grand River Avenue at Power Road. Shown above is a Bell Telephone worker pointing out some of the complicated mechanics of operation with a dial system.



FIRST PROJECT began on the Farmington to Brighton Expressway was the overpass to carry traffic over Farmington Road just south of the priesent US-16 Cut-Off. Work continues on the overpass with projects on other portions of the highway also started later in the year. The highway is scheduled for completion sometime in 1857.



SEWER TREATMENT and water systems for Kendall-wood Subdivision, located at Farmington Road and Twelve Mile, were taken over in November by the Township of Farmington-He Township, by resolution, agreed to serve as a permanent and continuing authority for the systems with the understanding hat Thompsog-Brown Company, developers, will pay all operating costs in accordance with specific time limits set up in the contract. Shown above is the sewer treatment plant, located on Twelye Mile Road between Farmington and Power Roads.


