DR. LOUIS WARREN, LINCOLN AUTHORITY, TO SPEAK FEB. 3

Dr. Louis A. Warren, who has contributed more monographs on Abraham Lincoln than any other living author, will speak in Farmington on Wednesday, February 3, at 8:00 p.m. in the high school library, 32000 Shiloh Avenue, in a public meeting sponsored by the Friends of the Library.

At one time, Dr. Warren edited a newspaper at Hodgenville, Kentucky, the birthplace of Lincoln, where he gathered data for his first book.

As director of the Lincoln Foundation at Fort Wayne, Indiana, he has spoken on Lincoln in nearly every state and in all of the principal cities. He is now on his 28th annual Lincoln lecture itinerary. His talk in Farmington has been arranged by George E. Griscom, general agent of the Lincoln National Life Insurance Company in Detroit.

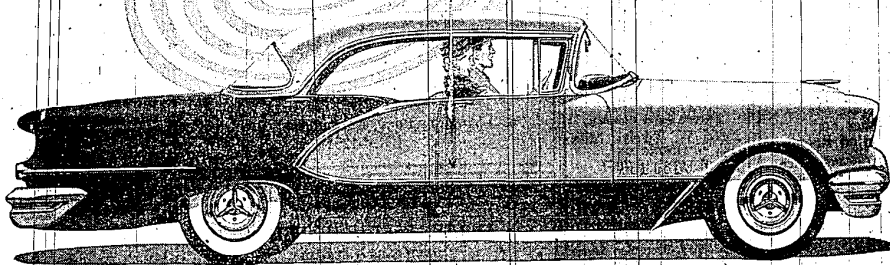

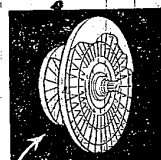
