

### Goodwill Pick-Up Set For Feb. 6

Contributions to Goodwill Industries have meant that an average of 450 handicapped people have been able to work during the past year.

"Enough discards have been contributed so that Goodwill's production line has been operating through December and the first half of January without layoffs," said Miss Lora Ault, local Goodwill representative.

"To insure against cutbacks during February, however, we are asking those who can, to get their discards together and call me at GR. 4-4294. The Goodwill trucks will be in this area on Monday, February 6," Miss Ault said.

"We are making an emergency call to have more discards, but at the same time, we wish to thank fully all those who have helped us so wholeheartedly during the first half of the winter months," she continued.

The nature of Goodwill's business is seasonal. Contributions are heavy in the spring and early fall when housewives do the major share of their housecleaning. Other months are slow, with February and early March being the slowest.
