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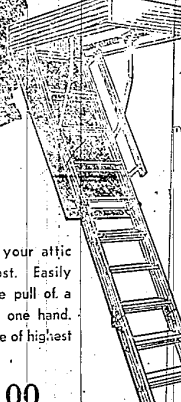

presentation of facts. Judge Holland suggested that the case be continued for two weeks to allow for discussion between the parties. Leonard stated that if no satisfactory agreement can be reached the case will probably go to trial.

The case was entered in court by the Dacile, Trucking Company after the Township Board had cancelled its permit for the removal of "top soil" on the basis of alleged violations of the agreement. Property owners in the vicinity of Fourteen Mile and Farmington Roads had registered numerous protests with the Board regarding the removal of the soil prior to the cancellation of the permit. The property owners charged that the operation was in violation of the Township zoning ordinance in regard to both the removal of soil and the conducting of a commercial activity in a residential zone.

DOG VACCINATION CLINIC TO BE HELD HERE THIS SUNDAY

Plans have been completed by the Oakland County Animal Welfare Division for the holding of a special dog vaccination clinic on Sunday afternoon, February 12, at the Farmington Township Fire Hall on Wheeler Street.

The clinic will be held from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Fire Hall, located at 21420 Wheeler Street, one block east of Middlebelt just north of Grand River. The clinic is arranged by the Animal Welfare Division of the County Health Department in cooperation with the Farmington Township Board. The Oakland County Veterinary Medical Association furnishes the Veterinarian as a public service, with no remuneration to them. The Veterinarian at the clinic in Farmington will be H. Houghton, D. V. M.

There will be a charge of \$1.50 for each vaccination to cover the cost of the anti-fabies serum.

for many subdivisions. Over 75 per cent of those contacted have signed petitions for the water district in several of the subdivisions.

Dr. Gadbury is a report to the group, re-emphasized the importance of supplying water to the residents of the city area. He also attempted to show that the advantages of forming the water district and obtaining water for the areas would outweigh the cost to individual property owners.

According to Dr. Gadbury, the strongest objections to setting up the water district are being voiced by owners of large tracts of land in the district who have no intentions of subdividing their property.

Following reports, the meeting was turned over to open discussion. Several questions regarding the proposed water system were raised from the floor of the assembly.

The Bradley Rexall Drug Store, located at 32323 Grand River, Farmington, was presented with a special award on February 1 by the Rexall Drug Company.

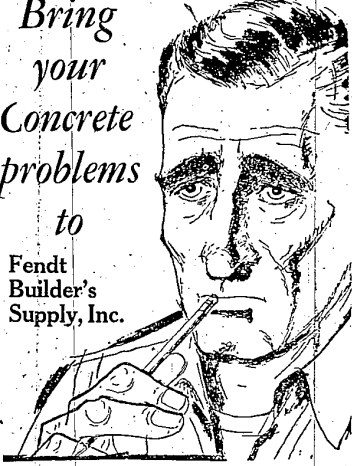

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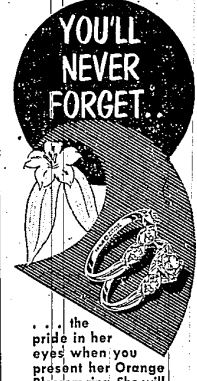
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
